Bringing children's books to life in Hertfordshire and Buckinghamshire



Dear Parents & Carers

A very warm welcome to the inaugural Chorleywood Children's Literary Festival or Great Little Litfest as it has come to be known.

The same team that bring you the successful Chorleywood Literary Festival (Chorleywood LitFest) are organising the first child-friendly book festival in the region. The events, which coincide with World Book Day (www.worldbookday.com) will bring together authors, illustrators, poets and storytellers with their audience – children from primary school age to A-level, with a few adult-friendly events thrown in to keep the grown up ones happy!

Great Little LitFest will run from Tuesday 5th March to Tuesday 19th March 2013 and features some of the most successful published children's authors and poets; bringing to life their stories and how they write, and enthusing children to read and write both fiction and non-fiction for their own enjoyment.

Confirmed speakers include Carol Ann Duffy, Rachel Bright, Dr Kevin Fong, Simon Mayo, Patrick Hennessey, Laura Dockrill, Jez Alborough, Ian Whybrow, Sam Gayton, Lauren Oliver, Jacqueline Harvey, Marissa Meyer, Paul Stewart and Chris Riddell, Louise Yates and Christopher William Hill.

Great Little Litfest events comprise four main strands:

- 1. A Schools Programme with successful authors and illustrators of children's books speaking at local schools;
- 2. A series of Public Events (Saturday 9th and Sunday 10th March), at which some of the authors listed above will talk about their work, and there will be crafty and arty workshops (Red Ted Art), a children's cookery festival (Cinnamon Square), and a Storytelling Picnic;
- 3. Specially formed book groups for children, which shadow the Blue Peter Book Awards; and
- 4. Writing competitions for children and students of all ages.







At the last count we had 21 schools within the region participating in The Schools Programme. If your child or children attend a school which is hosting an author visit, you may already have received or will shortly be receiving notification from the school.

Hopefully you will have received just before half term a Great Little Litfest flyer via children's book bags.
